



## From the President *Edward G. Anderson*



Greetings to all my fellow System Dynamics Society colleagues. It is truly a pleasure to be writing you as your President for 2014, given all the exciting developments and activities going on within the Society. Before I get into those, however, I would like to begin by thanking outgoing President Kim Warren. Kim has not only facilitated the development of a long-term strategy for the Society, but his term in office in 2013 went a long way to beginning its implementation.

I also want to thank the following outgoing members of the Policy Council for all their hard work: David Ford (Past President), Allyson Beall, and Markus Schwaninger. Thanks also to Martin Schaffernicht for his service as VP Chapter Activities, and to David Andersen for his service as VP Finance, (fortunately both have agreed to continue to serve another term.)

Please also join me in welcoming the following new officers and members to the Council: Jürgen Strohhecker (President Elect), Kenneth Cooper (VP Professional Practice), Jim Duggan, Warren Farr, Elke Husemann, and David Wheat; and returning officers in new roles: Kim Warren (Past President) and

Peter Hovmand (VP Marketing and Communications).

A number of powerful developments are taking place within the Society. Key findings from the Society Strategy Report, led so ably by Kim Warren, were (1) the Society must better publicize both itself and the field of System Dynamics as a whole; (2) the Society must reach out to provide additional services to practitioners; and (3) the Society must expand to embrace the Asia-Pacific region.

With respect to publicity, we have created a new office, the VP Marketing and Communication, which Peter Hovmand has agreed to take on. Peter's proposed strategy is to start a number of multi-pronged and mutually self-supporting initiatives, which one might almost say are systemic in nature! In particular, he is leveraging work on the Case Repository that the Society has been gathering during the past year. While much has been accomplished with the Case Repository, we still need many more cases to show how System Dynamics can impact the various aspects of the world we live and work in. Last summer, during the wonderful 2013 International System Dynamics Conference in Cambridge, Massachusetts we held a focus group of practitioners. From them we derived a list of wants that are driving our efforts this year in expanding services to this important group. Kenneth Cooper has agreed to spearhead this initiative by becoming the Society's first VP Professional Practice. As the governing body of the System Dynamics Society, the Policy Council meets twice a year.

The 2014 winter meeting opened with an electronic discussion in December 2013. The second session was a face-to-face meeting in Cambridge, Massachusetts on March 6th to discuss administrative and open policy issues as well as to develop and propose motions. The third session, spanning approximately five weeks after the face-to-face meeting, is an online discussion and includes voting on proposed motions.

The meeting included reports by officers and committees, publication reports, conference reports, and existing and new business. Motions being considered for this meeting include the slate of candidates to take office in 2015, recognition of the South Africa Chapter, appointments due to VP position vacancies, appointment of standing committee members, and appointment of 2015 conference program chairs.

**SYDIC Workshop** - The First International Italian Chapter (SYDIC) Workshop was held in Rome, Italy on January 21-22, 2014. This two-day event was hosted by the Sapienza University of Rome at the premises of the Dipartimento di Ingegneria Informatica, Automatica e Gestionale Antonio Ruberti.



Around 60 attendees, including academics and students, private and public managers, practitioners, and consultants, took part in the workshop, chaired by the SYDIC president, Stefano Armenia (Sapienza University of Rome).

The primary theme of the workshop was "System Dynamics for Policy Assessment & Strategy Development." It was aimed at building both new capacity in System Dynamics modelers as well as developing the field by disseminating the culture of System Dynamics as well as its possible applications. **Asia-Pacific System Dynamics Conference at Senshu University, Tokyo, Japan on 22-24 February 2014** - In July 2013, the Japan Chapter wrote that they would be honoured and happy to host the 2014 Asia-Pacific Conference. Six months later this event was a reality, held in Tokyo just last month.

This event was co-sponsored by the Society through the Development Fund. It celebrated the 50 year anniversary of the first publication of System Dynamics work in Japan. A number of senior System Dynamicists travelled to Japan to give a series of lectures, workshops, and to participate in such a major event.

The plenary papers were outstanding, the workshops excellent, and the parallel session papers were very interesting and stimulating, with opportunities to help students, academics, and practitioners.

Conference participants came from more than 25 countries, including Australia, Canada, Chile, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Latvia, Malaysia, New Zealand, Nigeria, Philippines, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, USA, UAE, UK, and Vietnam. There were about 95 conference participants, 7 plenary presentations, 31 parallel session papers, and 8 workshops.

The overall organization of the conference at Senshu University was extremely good and there was time to interact with colleagues and make new contacts with people from the Asia-Pacific region.

Highlights of the conference included the Welcome Reception and Conference Banquet, where superb Japanese cuisine was mixed with some formal comments celebrating 50 years of System Dynamics in Japan, and reflections on the changes in Japan since the International System Dynamics Conference was held there in 1995.

At the conference Business Meeting, it was agreed that we would try to hold a formal Asia-Pacific Conference every two years, with the next conference possibly located in Singapore in 2016. We would also like to hold some activity in the region every alternative year. Participants were enthusiastic about creating a new Society Chapter covering Southeast Asian countries, and they will be proceeding with a proposal in the near future. *Continued, next page.*

We have had a number of very well-received webinars, including presentations on C-Roads and ReThink Health. ## System Dynamics Summer School

A three day International System Dynamics Summer School will be held July 16-18, 2014 in Delft, the Netherlands, immediately preceding the Society’s conference.
